

**3rd INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE
AND DOCTORAL CONSORTIUM
ON ORGANIZATION DEVELOPMENT AND CHANGE
14-16 June, 2010 Lyon, France**

Organized in partnership with the ISEOR, the Organization Development and Change Division of the Academy of Management (USA), co-sponsored by the Management Consulting Division of the AOM

Languages of communications: English, Spanish or French

Rationale:

Since 2006, international conferences and doctoral consortium of the ODC division of the AOM took place every other year at ISEOR, University of Jean Moulin Lyon 3 and was very successful, enabling an overall 380 presentations of OD and Change academics and doctoral students from 17 countries. Indeed, these events showed how value added is the development of relationships across the Atlantic to share knowledge and experience in the field of research on themes such as:

- Comparing research methods
- Comparing the Doctoral Curricula in the field of ODC and MC in the US and in Europe
- Preparing a Ph.D. when in active life
- Research on change management theories and evaluation methods of the results
- Bridging the gap between change methodologies and management control approaches to planned change

Format of the 2010 conference and doctoral consortium:

The consortium will consist of two kinds of presentations:

- Papers, conferences and testimonies proposed by academics aimed at presenting the various and supplementary approaches applied to change management in different cultural settings.
- Workshops, where doctoral students and executive doctoral students are invited to present the progress of their research project in order to debate and exchange.

The best papers of academics and of doctoral students (if co-authored with their director of research) will be proposed for publication in the Journal *Sciences de Gestion/ Management Sciences/ Ciencias de Gestión*.

Venue:

ISEOR Research Center, University of Jean Moulin Lyon 3, is the pilot research center of the doctoral program in Socio-Economic Approach to the management of change and to organization development. Up to now 109 doctoral theses have been defended at ISEOR by students from various countries all over the world, not to mention 52 doctoral researches now underway. Lyon, France is ideally located at the heart of Europe and is an academic powerhouse in the field of management. (see: www.lyon-france.com). The ISEOR research center has already organized several conferences with AOM (USA) : 2001(Management Consulting Division), 2004 and 2007 (Research Methods Division),(2005) Social Issues in Management Division), 2006 and 2008 (Organization Development and Change Division), 2009 (Social Issues in Management, Organization Development and Change, Research Methods Division, Organizations and the Natural Environment, Management Consulting and Practice Theme Committee).

Participation from the American side: AOM members and/or other North American academics as well as Latin American academics, doctoral students and executive doctoral students are expected.

Participation expected from the European side: at least 100 European doctoral students will present their project, and 40 European directors of research and academics have expressed their intention to participate.

Submissions format and deadlines: for doctoral students, executive doctoral students and academics: send an abstract (4,500 characters maximum) before December 20th, 2009. Full papers (15 pages or 30,000 characters maximum) in English, Spanish or French are expected by January 30th, 2010.

Format: MS word, Times New Roman 10 point font, single spaced. Margins: 0.91" left, 1.73" right, 0.98" top and 1.18" bottom. Indent 1st line of each paragraph. Orientation of sheets: portrait and pages facing one another for all the document. Sheets B5: 7.17" breadth 10.12"height. Headline 0" and bottom 0.79" Sub-headings should be bold, on a separate line, left-justified, and all caps. Title page should appear as follows: on a separate page from the body of the paper: TITLE of paper, TYPE: Doctoral student, Executive doctoral student, academic, CONTACT PERSON: Choose 1 person to be the contact person, LIST of authors' names, in desired sequence. CONTACT INFORMATION for each author, including the following: Name, Organization or University affiliation, Address, Phone, Fax, email

Participation fees:

-Doctoral students: €100, which includes registration, CD-ROM proceedings

-Academics and professional participants: €300, which includes registration, proceedings, lunches and gala dinner.
